A TRIPARTITE COLLABORATION ESTABLISHES AN INSTITUTE FOR PUBLIC CHRISTIANITY

[Singapore, 22 August 2014] – ETHOS Institute for Public Christianity (ETHOS), possibly Singapore's first Christian think tank, was launched on 15 August 2014. The launch event, a Breakfast Lecture held at the St

Andrew's Cathedral was attended by about 100 distinguished guests from the public, private, academic and

religious spheres. The inauguration of ETHOS marks a milestone in the history of the local Christian

community.

ETHOS was formed by National Council of Churches in Singapore, Trinity Theological College and The Bible

Society of Singapore. ETHOS seeks to serve church and society by engaging contemporary issues and

trends from the Christian perspective. To achieve this, ETHOS will:

conduct studies on important topics and issues from the Christian perspective

organise regular lectures, seminars, conferences and symposiums for the Christian public

provide resources to Churches and Christians in different professions and vocations

• contribute resources to the National Council of Churches in Singapore

"Through ETHOS, we hope to communicate good biblical principles that the church needs to hold on to and

be able to discuss the same in the public square," said Bishop Dr Wee Boon Hup, Chairman of ETHOS

Institute for Public Christianity and President of The National Council of Churches in Singapore.

"Trinity Theological College is pleased to be partnering with the National Council of Churches of Singapore

and The Bible Society of Singapore on the establishment of ETHOS Institute for Public Christianity," said

Rev Dr Ngoei Foong Nghian, Vice Chairman of ETHOS and Principal of Trinity Theological College (TTC).



"TTC has been addressing societal issues from the Christian perspective since its inception. With this collaboration, we envision ETHOS to be a vibrant centre where people will come to be educated in the Christian perspective and for Christians to understand that our faith is more than just a personal faith but a faith that will impact people for the common good," he commented.

Some of the research topics already in the pipeline include education and society, reaching out to the children and youth in the 21st century, marriage and family, social media, civility and society and gambling, integrated resorts and society.

"The Bible Society of Singapore is delighted to be part of this very important and timely establishment of ETHOS Institute of Public Christianity," said Pastor Ezekiel Tan, Director of ETHOS and the General Secretary of The Bible Society of Singapore. "Through this collaboration we hope to equip the Church and Christian public in Singapore to better engage in social issues that affect everyone," he added.

ETHOS' first Chairman is Bishop Dr Wee Boon Hup, President of the NCCS. The institute's other key office holders are Rev Dr Ngoei Foong Nghian, Vice Chairman of ETHOS and Principal of Trinity Theological College and Pastor Ezekiel Tan, Director of ETHOS and General Secretary of The Bible Society of Singapore. Bishop Terry Kee from the Lutheran Church in Singapore is the institute's Ambassador for Interfaith Relations and Mr Lim K Tham is its Honorary Director. Dr Roland Chia, Trinity Theological College's Chew Hock Hin Professor of Christian Doctrine, serves as the institute's Theological & Research Advisor and will spearhead ETHOS project initiatives.
