Statement by the National Council of Churches of Singapore

The National Council of Churches of Singapore is deeply grieved and concerned by reports of suspicious parcels sent to several mosques, containing materials that appear intended to cause offence. Such acts have no place in our society. They undermine the trust and mutual respect that form the foundation of our multi-religious harmony.

The Council therefore unequivocally condemns such actions and extends our solidarity to our Muslim neighbours. Every religious community must be able to worship in safety and without fear. When one faith is targeted, the peace and harmony of all is placed at risk.

Religious harmony in Singapore has been carefully nurtured through vigilance, respect and sustained interfaith interaction and cooperation. The Council values its longstanding relationship with the Islamic Religious Council in Singapore. We remain firmly committed to working together to strengthen mutual trust and to uphold the values of tolerance and respect that are vital to our nation.

We call on all communities to stand united in rejecting divisive acts and to continue promoting peace and harmony for the good of Singapore.
